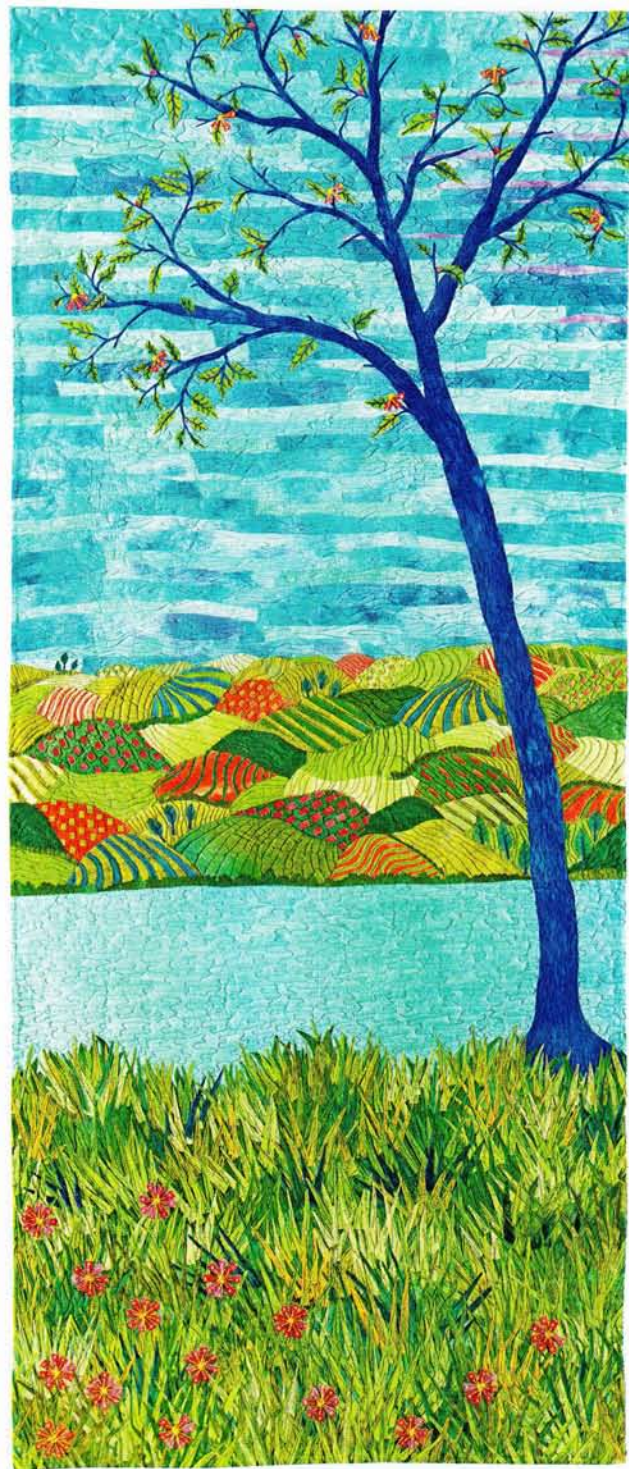


SPRING
